

# Suno.com Song Endings Worksheet

Purpose: To guide us through understanding and applying different types of song endings using examples and prompts for creating unique song conclusions with Suno.com.

## 1. Abrupt Ending

Definition: The song ends suddenly without warning, leaving the listener surprised.

Examples:

[I Want You (She's So Heavy) by The Beatles]

[Dancing with Myself by Billy Idol] (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FG1NrQYXjLU>)

Create Your Own:

- Prompt for [Suno.com](https://www.suno.com): [End the song abruptly after a climactic point without any fade or resolution]

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## 2. Fade-Out

Definition: The song gradually decreases in volume until it fades away.

Examples:

[Hey Jude by The Beatles] ([https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=A\\_MjCqQoLLA](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=A_MjCqQoLLA))

[Purple Rain by Prince] ([https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TvnYmWpD\\_T8](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TvnYmWpD_T8))

Create Your Own:

- Prompt for [Suno.com](https://www.suno.com): [Fade out the ending slowly, extending the final melody to create a lingering effect]

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## 3. Instrumental Outro

Definition: The song ends focusing on instruments, often highlighting a solo.

Examples:

[Hotel California by The Eagles] (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EqPtz5qN7HM>)

[Layla by Derek and the Dominos] ([https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Th3ycKQV\\_4k](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Th3ycKQV_4k))

Create Your Own:

- Prompt for [Suno.com](https://www.suno.com): [Conclude the song with a powerful instrumental solo that showcases the lead guitar]

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## 4. Loop Ending

Definition: The song ends by repeating a phrase or chord sequence, creating a cyclical feel.

Examples:

[Hey Ya! by OutKast] (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PWgvGjAhvIw>)

[Smells Like Teen Spirit by Nirvana] (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hTWKbfoikQw>)

Create Your Own:

- Prompt for [Suno.com](https://www.suno.com): [Loop the final chorus multiple times, gradually building layers before ending]

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## 5. Modulation Ending

Definition: The song changes key at the end, often raising the pitch for a dramatic climax.

Examples:

[I Will Always Love You by Whitney Houston]

[Livin' on a Prayer by Bon Jovi] (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lDK9QqIzhwk>)

Create Your Own:

- Prompt for [Suno.com](https://www.suno.com): [In the final verse, modulate the key upwards to elevate the song's intensity]

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## 6. Resolving Chord Ending

Definition: The song ends on a final chord that resolves, providing a sense of closure.

Examples:

[Let It Be by The Beatles] (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QDYfEBY9NM4>)

[Imagine by John Lennon] (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YkgkThdzX-8>)

Create Your Own:

- Prompt for [Suno.com](https://www.suno.com): [End with a strong resolving chord that brings the melody to a satisfying close]

Identify Your Preferred Ending Style:

- Which ending style resonates most with your music? Why?

Create a Song Using One of These Endings:

- Select an ending style and describe how you would apply it to your song.
- Use the provided prompt to implement this ending in Suno.com.

Experiment with Multiple Endings:

- How does changing the ending affect the overall feel and message of the song?
- Try applying different endings to the same song and note the variations in impact.

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## Ideas

- Consider combining different ending styles for a unique effect (e.g., a modulation followed by a fade-out).
- Listen to the example songs on YouTube and Suno.com (Library) attentively to understand how each ending style influences the listener's experience.
- Use these concepts to enhance storytelling and emotional expression in your music.
- Explore additional resources and tutorials on Suno.com to further refine your song endings.
